Winsemius Awards to honour Dr. Albert Winsemius' legacy and celebrate 60 years of long-lasting relations between Singapore and the Netherlands.

May 9, 2025 (Singapore) — The Dutch Chamber of Commerce (DutchCham) is honoured to announce that Ms Grace Fu, Minister for Sustainability and the Environment and Minister-in-charge of Trade Relations, Ambassador of the Netherlands to Singapore and Brunei, Mrs. Anneke Adema, along with Mrs. Petri Hofsté will be our esteemed guests of honour at the Winsemius Awards 2025. These distinguished guests symbolize and reinforce the long-standing bond and robust business ties between Singapore and the Netherlands. The evening will be hosted by Joel Tng.

This year the Winsemius Awards are **particularly special** as the Netherlands and Singapore commemorate the milestone of 60 years of bilateral relations, while DutchCham will also celebrate 35 years of its presence in Singapore.

The DutchCham Winsemius Awards are named in honour of Dutch economist Dr. Albert Winsemius (1910-1996), who significantly influenced Singapore's national economic development strategy. He is best known for his role as the economic advisor to Singapore from 1961 to 1984. He led the United Nations Survey Mission to Singapore and presented a 10-year development plan aimed at transforming Singapore from an entrepot trading port into a hub for manufacturing and industrialisation.

Winsemius is credited by Mr. Lee Kuan Yew for laying the foundations of Singapore's economic progress and prosperity. Mr. Lee Kuan Yew remarked: "Singapore and I personally are indebted to him (Winsemius) for the time, energy and development he gave to Singapore. I am proud to have known him and to have been his friend." As an architect of Singapore's economic policies in the early days, Dr. Albert Winsemius and Mr. Lee Kuan Yew developed a close relationship over the years. Their friendship symbolizes the strong ties and connections between Singapore and the Netherlands.

In recognition of his contributions to Singapore's economic development, Winsemius received several honours. In 1967, Yusof Ishak, the first President of Singapore, awarded him the Distinguished Service Medal. In 1970, he was conferred an honorary degree by the National University of Singapore. In 1976, he received the National Trades Union Congress' May Day Gold Medal of Honour.

The Winsemius Awards celebrate and recognize innovative and impactful achievements, serving as the most prestigious form of recognition for Dutch or Singaporean companies in Singapore in areas such as collaboration, business achievement, innovation, social responsibility and sustainability, truly reflecting the spirit and legacy of Dr. Albert Winsemius.
